NATIONAL CANDLE SAFETY WEEK

As Autumn rolls in, here at Absafe we like nothing more than a keeping ourselves cosy in front of the fire with some atmospheric and sweet smelling candles.

Next week marks National Candle Safety Week, and the Chief Fire Officers Association (CFOA) has provided some useful information in candle care to ensure you stay safe at home.

- Make sure candles are secured in a proper holder, on a stable surface, and away from materials that may catch fire, such as curtains.
- Children and pets should never be left alone with lit candles.
- Don't leave a lit candle unattended. Put candles out whenever you leave the room, and make sure they're put out completely at night.
- Keep the wax pool clear of wick trimmings, matches and debris at all times.
- Burn candles in a well-ventilated room, but avoid draughts, vents or air currents. This will help prevent rapid or uneven burning, sooting and excessive dripping.
- Trim the wick to ¼ inch each time before burning. Long or crooked wicks can cause uneven burning, dripping or flaring.

- Avoid moving candles once they are lif.
- Follow the manufacturer's recommendations on burn time and proper use.
- Always put scented candles in a heat resistant holder, as these candles are designed to liquify when heated, to maximise fragrance.
- Do not burn several candles close together as this might cause the flame to flare.
- Use a snuffer or a spoon to put out candles. It's safer than blowing them out which may cause sparks.
- Even with these precautions it's vital to be prepared should the worst happen. A working smoke alarm can give you the vital time you need to get out, stay out, and call 999. Keep yourself and your loved ones safe by testing your alarm regularly and by planning and practising an escape route.



BEWARE OF NEW ITUNES SCAM

Police Scotland has received a number of complaints relating to a scam involving iTunes vouchers.

Scammers are contacting victims, usually elderly or vulnerable people, by telephone asking them to make payments over the phone.

In these most recent cases, scammers are demanding payment for Inland Revenue fees. Police Scotland advises that the scam follows a certain formula. The victim receives a call to make a payment to clear the debt by purchasing iTunes Gift Cards from the nearest retailer.

After the cards have been purchased, the victim is asked to pay the alleged outstanding debt by sharing the 16-digit code on the back of the card with the caller over the phone.

Constable Jim Watson said: "The Inland Revenue would never require any payment by means of ITunes or any other gift cards. If you receive a call making such demands then please hang up and contact the Police.

"It's important to know that iTunes Gift Cards can ONLY be used to purchase goods and services on the iTunes Store, App Store, iBooks Store, or for an Apple Music membership. If you're contacted by telephone and approached to use the cards for payment out with the iTunes Store, App Store, iBooks Store, or Apple Music, you are very likely the target of a scam and should immediately report it to your local police.

"Please do not ever provide the numbers on the back of the card to someone you do not know. Once those numbers are provided to the scammers, the funds on the card will likely be spent before you are able to contact Apple and cancel the cards."
