READY, STEADY, WINTER

As winter takes hold across the north east, here at Absafe we want you to stay safe as you make your way to work or school and when out and about. Our friends at Ready Scotland have provided us with some top tips for ensuring you stay safe when the weather turns for the worst.

TAKE HEED OF WEATHER WARNINGS

- Before travelling, check your local and national weather forecast and keep up-todate with the latest weather warnings
- Consider whether you need to travel right now or if you can wait until the weather improves
- For real time traffic information visit <u>Traffic Scotland</u> and for public transport information, call Traveline on 0871 200 2233 on.

WHEN SNOW IS FORECAST

- Tune-in to the forecast and Met Office weather warnings
- Check the road conditions and think about alternative routes
- Consider public transport as an alternative if it's a possibility for you
- Tell someone where you're going and what time you expect to be there or back
- Allow extra time for your journey
- Fully charge your mobile phone, and take a charger with you
- Make sure you have appropriate clothing, equipment and food

- Pack an emergency travel kit if you are travelling by car - this will stand you in good stead at any time of year
- Think about getting winter tyres



FLOODING

- If your area is at risk of flooding, remember you should not drive or walk through flood water.
- Six inches of fast-flowing water can knock over an adult and two feet of water can move a car.

CYCLING AND WALKING IN ADVERSE CONDITIONS

 If heavy winds are forecast, consider taking alternative transport if you normally cycle.
Winds can easily blow you off your bike and cause serious injuries.

- Consider heavier duty tyres to cope with slippery surfaces and get a routine bike maintenance check
- Wear clothes that help you be seen on your bike such as bright and light reflective items
- Get a good set of mud guards
- If walking in bad conditions, take the usual sensible precautions - wear appropriate footwear and clothing
- Consider getting ice grips to wear over your shoes - this can give you an extra grip in icy conditions

DOG ATTACKS ON LIVESTOCK

Police Scotland has informed us of the rise in the number of reports where livestock have been attacked by domestic dogs. These dogs have not been not under the proper control of a responsible person or owner. In the majority of cases reported to Police, the offending dog has come from the surrounding area having escaped from a garden or allowed to roam the area.

Attacks on livestock by dogs can be prevented, if you consider the following:

- Ensure your dog is under proper control at all times when in the countryside. All dogs have a natural instinct to chase and this is often enough for livestock to become distressed and be injured
- Do not let your dog roam free and if kept outdoors, ensure the area is properly secure
- Never take your dog into a field where there is livestock
