NEW YEAR, NEW YOU

With the festive period well and truly over, the only part of Christmas that remains is the extra weight you've gained. For many of us, January brings a new opportunity to lose excess pounds and try out a new fitness outdoor routine. The following list outlines some top tips, so you stay safe outside and get in shape for summer.



Carry a form of identification. Most exercise
 clothing has small pockets which keep your

- driver's license or a small card that lists your phone number and an emergency contact
- Take your mobile phone with you. In areas
 where phone reception is not good or your phone
 runs out of battery, carry some change for a
 payphone just in case you need to make a call in
 an emergency
- No valuable jewellery. Wearing expensive jewelry may bring unwanted attention to you and make you a target of thieves, so leave valuable watches, rings and earrings at home
- Power in numbers. Exercising with a friend or group reduces your chance of being targeted. A little friendly competition also helps you reduce your fitness goals too
- Know your route. Familiarise yourself with your exercise route and know where there are any areas which may be potentially dangerous. Plot your run or walk using your smart phone's map

feature to ensure you're aware of your surroundings

- Dogs are your best friend. If you own a dog, then
 take your pooch with you. Plus, the dog benefits
 from the extra exercise. If you don't own a dog,
 maybe borrow one from a friend or neighbour
- Run against traffic, bike with traffic. This
 ensures that you are most visible to vehicles.
 When possible, run on pavements away from
 traffic and cycle in designated biking lanes
- No playlists on headphones. As tempting as it is
 to help pass the time, don't wear headphones
 while exercising outdoors. Your ability to pay
 attention to traffic and other people is greatly
 reduced while listening to music, and you may
 look preoccupied and vulnerable.
- Be visible. If exercising in the dark then make sure to wear bright reflective clothing. There are many products on the market with reflective material that will help you to be seen outdoors.

LATEST FROM POLICE SCOTLAND

As the festive decorations are boxed up for another year and households return to a normal routine, it is worth reminding everyone about the importance of home security.

Following Christmas and the sales many people may have expensive new equipment, gadgets and bikes in their homes. Now is a good time to review your home security and take some simple steps to discourage anyone from entering your home and taking your possessions.

Many of the incidents reported in the North East are committed by opportunists who do not have to break in at all because a door or window has been left open or unlocked. Therefore, remember to keep your home securely locked at all times, even if you are inside.

- Don't leave keys on the inside of door locks, under mats or anywhere else an intruder may easily find them
- Don't put your name or room number on your keyring if you live in shared accommodation. If it is lost or stolen, the thief will have information that could direct them to your home and your property
- Don't keep house keys and car keys on the same key ring
- Avoid keeping large amounts of cash in the house.
 If you must, then disperse it in various locations
- Don't leave valuables in sight of windows
- If you have a calendar, avoid mounting it near a
 window from where appointments can potentially
 be seen this may give an indication of when a
 property will be empty
- Take a couple of extra minutes before you leave your house to make sure all your doors and windows are locked, including any vehicles
- Make your home looked occupied when you are out by leaving lights on or using timed lights
- If you store items in a garden shed or outbuilding fit a good quality hasp and padlock to the door, fitted with dome headed or non-returnable screws to prevent tampering
- Photograph your bike and record all of your bike's details and distinguishing features and keep in a

safe place. The serial number can be found on the bottom bracket

- Register your bicycle securely online at the National Cycle Database www.bikeregister.com.
 Doing this may help to recover your bike if it goes missing.
- Security mark your bike's frame with a UV pen or other method - the mark should include your home postcode and house number
- Insure your bike, either on contents insurance or separately if required
